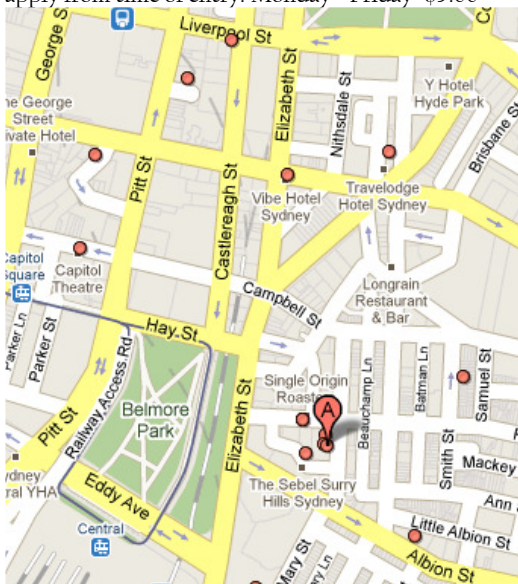
### Earlybird Fees
